Annie Ruth Johnson was born on March 15, 1950, in Leigh, Texas to Johnnie Ruth (May) Irving and Gilbert Williams. She was raised by Mr. & Mrs. Aubrey “Baby Ray” Irving Jr. in Kansas City, MO along with Michael May her first cousin.
