### Obituary

Christine S. Hill was born January 25, 1955 in Boonville, Missouri. She was the seventh-oldest

child of Perry Layton Hill, Sr. and Sophia Mae Rowles Hill. She accepted Christ at an early age

and was baptized in Kansas City, Missouri. She was a current member of United Believers

Community Church. Christine's life's journey ended on Wednesday, June 29, 2022 in Overland

Park, Kansas. She is preceded in death by her parents; brothers, Perry Layton Hill, Jr., and Terry

Wayne Hill, Sr.; two sisters, Patricia Diane Hill Newsome and De'Bra Mischelle Hill Wheeler;

and one nephew, Christian Dion Hill.

Christine began her education in Kansas City, Missouri at H. C. Kumpf elementary school. She

graduated in 1973 and was a proud Paseo Pirate where she was a member of the Pep Team. After

graduation from high school, she attended Texas Southern University in Houston, Texas and

received a Bachelor of Science in Biology with an emphasis in Education. She returned to

graduate school in 1999 and received a Master of Arts in Education from Webster University.

Christine was initiated into the sisterhood of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated on May 4, 1974 to the Epsilon Psi Chapter in Columbia, Missouri.

Christine was employed with ExxonMobile as a manufacturing process plant operator in the

Olefins Refinery in Baytown, Texas. She retired from ExxonMobile in 1991 and relocated to

Kansas City, Missouri where she began her career as an educator with the Kansas City Public

School District. She taught Biology and Science at KC High School Prep, Central Middle,

Westport Middle, and Northeast High School. During her career, she went into work early and

stayed late for students who needed a safe space before and after school.

She saw herself as an

advocate and resource for students while teaching them how to advocate for themselves. After 27

years of teaching, she retired from Northeast High School in 2018.

After retirement, Christine spent her time volunteering with various local and national political

action groups, as well as the Kansas City chapter of the NAACP where she was a lifetime

member. As a devoted mother, she enjoyed reading her daughter's poetry. As a devoted sister,

she always lent a listening ear to her siblings and was always ready to assist anyone in their time

of need.
