Glenn Davis Sr. was born in Detroit, Michigan on May 20, 1948, to James Davis and Verla Williams. At an early age he, along with younger brother Harold, moved to Blackwell, Arkansas to live with his fraternal grandmother Mary "Grandma Davis" Agnes.

He attended and graduated high school in Morrilton, Arkansas.

Glenn joined the US Army in 1966 and served during the Vietnam War. He bravely distinguished himself in combat and was the recipient of a Purple Heart. He achieved the rank of Staff Sergeant and was honorably discharged in 1976.

Glenn was united in matrimony to Brenda Joyce Strickland on April 13, 1970, in Kansas City, Missouri. They were happily married for 35 years and had two sons Glenn Jr. and William.

Glenn joined and was a faithful member of St. Stephen Baptist Church in Kansas City. He worked in maintenance at the Kansas City Zoo for several years. He was an avid Kansas City Chiefs fan and he loved to go fishing in his leisure time.

Glenn Davis Sr., 76, departed this life on April 1, 2025, at St. Joseph Medical

Center in Kansas City, Missouri. He was preceded in death by his wife, Brenda Davis; both parents; son, William Anthony Davis; sisters, Ivy Jefferson, Linda Lanxter, and Carleen Lewis; brothers, Ronald "Butch" Lewis, and Raymond Lewis.
