Hubert Charles Eason, Jr., is a native of Kansas City, Missouri and son of Rev. Hubert C. Eason, Sr. and Annie Eason. He began this life December 7, 1956 and transitioned to eternal life on February 9, 2026.

He was a native of Kansas City, Missouri; graduated at Southeast High School and ultimately attended Bishop College in Marshall, Texas. Following College, he spent 40 faithful years at the Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) Railroad. In 1977, he began his career as a railroad clerk in Lincoln, Nebraska. He later moved to Kansas City and rose through the ranks becoming a Yardmaster, Senior Member of the Precision Execution Team and ultimately a Train Master.
