Obituary

Jeanette Riley Guliford was born in Kansas City, Kansas, August 15, 1929, to the union of Jesse Lee Everett and Russell Morris Riley. She received her education in the Kansas City, Kansas school district except for one year when she resided in Washington, D.C. with an aunt and uncle.

Jeanette returned to Kansas City and attended Northeast Junior High School and Sumner High School, graduating in the class of 1947.

She was baptized when she was nine years old by the late Reverend John Moore at Metropolitan Baptist Church in Kansas City, Kansas. Later, in her teens, she joined Olivet Institutional Baptist Church.

On December 26, 1947, Jeanette united in marriage with Arthur Sidney Guliford (Art). To this union are three children, Arthur Sidney Guliford, Jr., Rodney Craig Guliford, and Lisa Lynette Guliford Carter.

In later years Jeanette united with First Baptist Church of Quindaro where she remained until her demise. She was a Trustee and Treasurer of the Scholarship Committee.

She was employed by Armco Steel Corporation for 20 years and by the State of Kansas with SRS for nine years.
