Marlene Reed Myers, age 89, went home to be with the Lord on Sunday, December 31, 2023. She was born on October 9, 1934, to Ina Reed Hicks and Leroy Reed, Sr. in Kansas City, Missouri.

Marlene graduated from Lincoln High School in 1952 and attended Lincoln Junior College of Kansas City, Missouri.

Marlene's work experience spanned over 33 years with the U.S. Government. Her career began at the Dwight D. Eisenhower VA Medical Center (formerly VA Center Wadsworth) in Leavenworth, Kansas followed by the Department of Army Finance and Accounting office at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. She transferred to Fort Carson, Colorado and worked for the Department of Army Finance until her retirement. Following retirement, she relocated to Kansas City, Missouri to be closer to family.

Marlene was a dedicated member of the Gregg Tabernacle African Methodist Episcopal Church. For several years she taught in the education department, served on the Courtesy Club, Usher Board and sang in the Senior Choir.

She was well known in the Leavenworth community as an excellent seamstress. Throughout their childhood, she made all the clothing for her three daughters, including special occasion gowns and matching outfits for the girls and their dolls. Often faced with limited resources, she generously crocheted a variety of afghans for an extended network of friends and family.

In addition to her parents and step-father Wayman Hicks, she is preceded in death by her brother Leroy Reed, son Robert Eugene Jackson and daughter Carla Yvette Jackson.
