Obituary

Mayola Thelma (Hill) Perkins was born on October 18, 1928, in Okmulgee, Oklahoma to Parents, James and Thelma Hill.

Mayola departed this life on March 25, 2018.

1951 to 1969 until they went out of business. She was later employed with the Holiday Inn from 1970 to 1992, until the time of retirement. She then went to work for the Goodwill Industry, government operated and owned from 1993 until 2007, making the decision to resign due to health reasons.

Mayola enjoyed spending her free time with her family, watching court TV shows, sports, especially the Oklahoma Sooners, Kansas City Chiefs, and the Kansas City Royals.
