Obituary

Pastor Victor M. Mitchell, was born in Los Angeles, CA on December 25, 1957 to Mittie and Clyde Mitchell. He lived there for about 6 weeks and then moved to Malvern, Ark where he was raised by his grandparents Meek & Gladys Powell for the remainder of his early and upper educational years and attended the University of Arkansas, Little Rock, Ark. After marriage, the family lived in Inglewood California for 18 years and moved to Grandview, MO where he resided for the last 24 years.

Victor met and married the love of his life Sandra, on April 3, 1980, whom he “feverously” chased and dated for 5 years prior to their married which lasted for over 41 years. Nothing compares to the love he and she have for each other and know that if you saw one you would see the other bringing up the rear. He dearly loved and appreciated his family and showed them that special love each and every day. There would not be a time that we would leave each other without saying “I love You” as we walked away. We will always remember that of him.

Victor currently worked for the Kansas City VA Medical Center as the Prosthetics Surgical Implants Manager, he also served as the African American Special Emphasis Program Co-Manager, Kansas City VA Medical Center Diversity and Inclusion Recruiter. He also worked for several other

federal agencies in California, Texas, and Kansas City over a total of 25 years. He had worked for Sprint for 12 years during his career.

While on a musical trip to Boston, Victor heard the Lord speak to him and as he communicated to others, the Lord said “It’s time to stop running, you must take your charge.” He spoke with Sandra about it while in Boston and even told the other musicians who had traveled with him there that he knew it was time for him to answer the Lord. He returned home to Inglewood and spoke with his Pastor, Rev. James A. Perkins, who responded and told him “I already knew it and was just waiting on you to answer the call”. He was officially licensed to the Gospel Ministry at True Friendship MBC in Inglewood, CA. Victor would go on to Preach, Teach and Speak God’s word when and wherever possible. He was called to Pastor King Solomon, MBC KC, KS and then to establish The Village Community Church, where he served diligently and faithfully. Due to health constraints, he had to step away from Pastoring, but never away from offering the word of God, where possible. If you ever heard him speak or preach, you knew that he was on a mission to proclaim God’s word to everyone, during Sunday Service, Revivals, Choir Rehearsal, and numerous other occasions.

As we all know Victor loved music to the fullest degree... He loved to sing, play and direct choirs and did so throughout many states. He held musical workshops in Los Angeles, CA; Boston, MA; Fort Riley, KS; Grandview, MO; Kansas City, KS; and Dallas, TX. He also participated in numerous singing organizations, one of which he so enjoyed, The Southern California Community Choir while living in California. He was a founding member of Musicians In Action (MIA) LA, CA. He held the position of the Minister of Music, Director and Musician for several churches in California, Texas, Kansas City, MO and Grandview, MO and during those times all knew that he was one to be reckoned with when it came to music as he was well respected among his musical peers.

Victor is survived by his wife Sandra of the home, Children Symphony Mitchell and V'ion Mitchell of Grandview, MO.
