Mozella wore many hats: baking, painting, sewing her own clothes and hats. She enjoyed playing miniature golf, bowling, singing and could be seen around Kansas City, on her three wheeled bicycle. She was also known to go

out and deliver cakes to the homeless, metro bus drivers and others for many years. Her favorite color was the yellow cake; her favorite hymn was “His Eye is on the Sparrow.”

Mozella leaves to cherish her memories a nephew, Michale McKinney; nieces Pam Wheeler; grandson Eugene R. Johnson III; granddaughter Norma J. Johnson Chapman; four great grandchildren, 2 great-great grandchildren, and a host of relatives and friends.
