Reginald Lee Pauley was born January 16, 1957, to Willie Mae Pauley. He was the youngest son of 7 siblings and born and raised in Kansas City, MO. He joined Emmanuel Baptist Church and was baptized in 1966. He attended Katherine B. Richardson Elementary School and graduated from Southeast High School in May 1975. He joined the US Navy in June 1975 and served on the USS Enterprise for four years.

After honorably discharging from the military, he entered civil service and joined the United States Post Office completing 39 years of service and retiring in 2015.

He married Sandra Davis April 13, 1985. They were married for 38 years and had two daughters.

Reginald was a devoted husband and father who enjoyed spending time with his family and friends. He was a loyal fan of the Oakland Raiders and American Negro League.
