Rosetta Reeves Clark was born December 25, 1945 in Augusta, Arkansas to Catherine Jones Alexander and Eugene Reeves. She was the second of 3 daughters. She was preceded in death by both parents, husband- Ervin Clark, and son- Walter Harris, Jr. preceded her in death.

She gave her life to Christ at an early age. She attended St. Luke's Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of Edward Liggins. Rosetta graduated from Carver High School in Augusta, Arkansas.
