She had a special way of making each grandchild feel unique and loved, creating memories that will be cherished forever. Sharon made sure that her grandchildren knew they were special. Her love as a nana was a legacy that will live on for generations, in every hug, every laugh, and every moment spent together.

As a daughter, Sharon carried a sense of duty, respect, and tenderness in her relationship with her parents. She made sure her parents' needs were met, not out of obligation, but out of deep love and gratitude. In moments of joy or

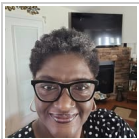
