presence known with her beautiful blue eyes. Mark Anthony Hayes, the first-born child to this family was just a year older than Sherri Renee' and would become a loving protective big brother.

Sherri Renee' Hayes Biggs received her eternal wings on January 5, 2023, at the age of 63 and fell asleep in Jesus at 2:00am while a patient at Hoeger House Rehabilitation facility located on the campus of Olathe Medical Center.

Sherri Renee' attended Linwood Elementary and Paseo High School in Kansas City, Missouri. She graduated from Santa Monica High School in Santa Monica, California and attended Santa Monica College.

Sherri Renee' received Christ at an early age and became a Believer while attending Christ Temple Pentecostal Church (now known as Victorious Life Church) located in Kansas City, Missouri and was baptized there. While a member at Christ Temple Church Sherri sang in the choir.

Sherri Renee' gave birth to only one child, Marquise De' Leon Anderson in 1984.

From 1990 to 2002 Sherri was married to William D. Biggs.

After briefly working at Lake City Ammunition, Sherri began her professional work career as a unit secretary at St. Luke's Hospital. She would become an account service representative and held the position at St. Luke's until she retired after approximately 26 years of service.

Sherri quickly became bored after retiring from St. Luke's Hospital and went back to work part-time as a switchboard operator at Research Medical Center where she worked for many years. She was also employed briefly as a receptionist at Overland Park Rehabilitation Center.

Sherri Renee' held an administrative office position at Olathe Medical Center from 2020 until she became ill in 2022 along with a part-time medical receptionist position at Kansas University Medical Center.

For those who knew and loved our feisty and beautiful Sherri Renee' could say that her diva-like personality was always apparent. You might even say that Sherri was not a shy person, and she often wore her emotions on her sleeves. Regardless to who she might be talking to if you asked her a direct question, she always had a colorful direct answer.

Sherri Renee' was a beloved daughter, sister, mother, grandmother, aunt, cousin, faithful friend, along with being a loyal coworker of great integrity; a team player, hard worker, responsible and most of all reliable.

Sherri shared good humor, much laughter and big smiles with her coworkers. She and many of the people she worked with shared a special bond. Every year Sherri would order numerous boxes of Girl Scout Cookies to share with her friends at work. Her coworkers at Research Medical Center have ordered those same cookies to distribute to the nursing staff at Olathe Medical Center that care for Sherri Renee'.

During the time Sherri worked at Research Medical Center she did her best to coerce all of her close coworkers to leave St. Luke's Hospital after she retired and come work with her at Research Medical Center.

Sherri Renee' stayed busy and led a very active life. She had a passion for shopping which included being a collector of elephants. She took pride in her wardrobe and always had the latest handbags along with stylish shoes and boots to match. She also loved interior decorating and her home was adorned with her favorite oriental artifacts.

When Sherri wasn't working she managed to plan trips often to Southern California and she went on a vacation with a large group of family and friends to Hawaii.

Even though Sherri Renee' Hayes Biggs finished her earthly journey much too soon, she finished strong! During her final days she would talk to the Good Lord daily and was at peace when He gathered her to Himself!
