During his employment he was a proud member of Teamsters Local 41. After retirement he worked part time for the Holiday Inn at the Stadium where he never met a stranger.

He married JoAnn Henry and they had one son Devan. He later married Berda Brown and became an integral part of her daughter Ebony Brown’s life. He leaves to mourn his passing his wife, Berda Warren, his children Derek, Cassandra, Cheryl, Devan and Ebony. His brothers Cornell (Cynthia), Monty (Barbara) and Keith, a sister Debbie (Larry), his grandchildren and nieces and nephews.
